- ILLINOIS CHEMICAL EDUCATION FOUNDATION ECOLAB SCHOLARSHIP - Open to students seeking a degree in: chemistry, chemical engineering, environmental engineering or high school chemistry teaching. **FAFSA:** *One of the first steps of the college financial aid process is completing the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form. The FAFSA enables students who qualify to receive federal/state grants, scholarships, as well as to participate in work-studies programs. Items needed to complete the FAFSA are: student's driver's license, student's social security card, records of untaxed*

income, and information regarding net worth of family and student assets. Parents and students MUST have their FAFSA id number created before having the ability to complete the FAFSA. Go to: <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch> to create the accounts. State law in Illinois requires all graduating seniors to submit the FAFSA or complete a FAFSA Nonparticipation Form.

**ACT Testing Dates:** The next ACT test date open for registration is April 13. Registration is due by March 8. Additional ACT testing dates for the year are June 8 and July 13. Registration is typically due 5 weeks before the testing date. Students may register at [www.ACTStudent.org](http://www.ACTStudent.org). Our high school code is 143-110.

**SAT Testing Dates:** The next SAT test date open for registration is May 4. Registration is due by April 19. Additional SAT testing date for the year is June 1. Starting with the March date, the SAT will be given digitally. Registration is typically due 5 weeks before the testing date. Students may register at [www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org). Our high school code is 143-110.
